

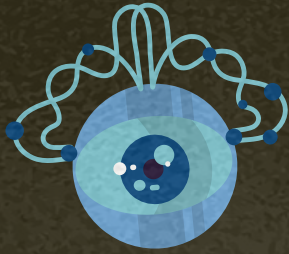


# Net Art Process Book



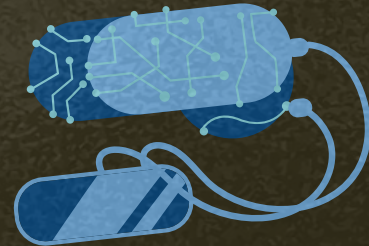

This process book records the steps of the net art project, starting from the randomized sentence that was made from an online article and progressing from there.



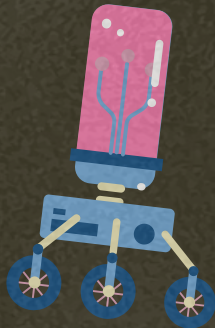
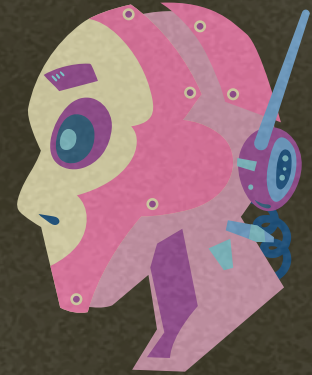
# Sentences from Articles

built from moon dust.

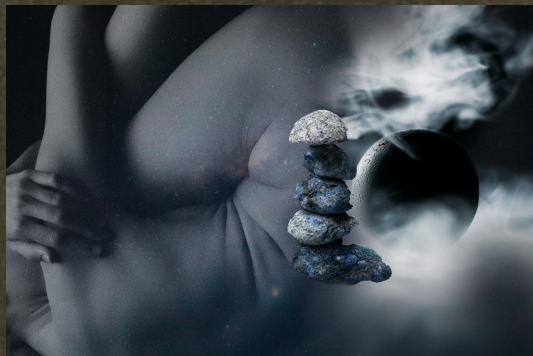
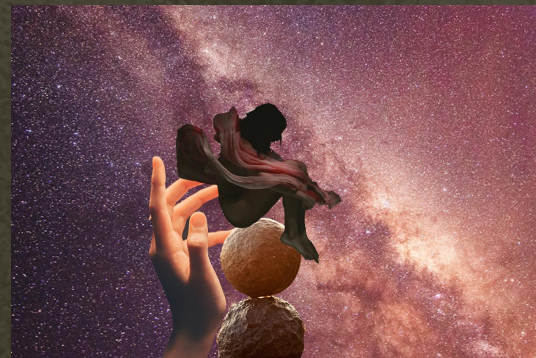
## Second sentence

from dust.

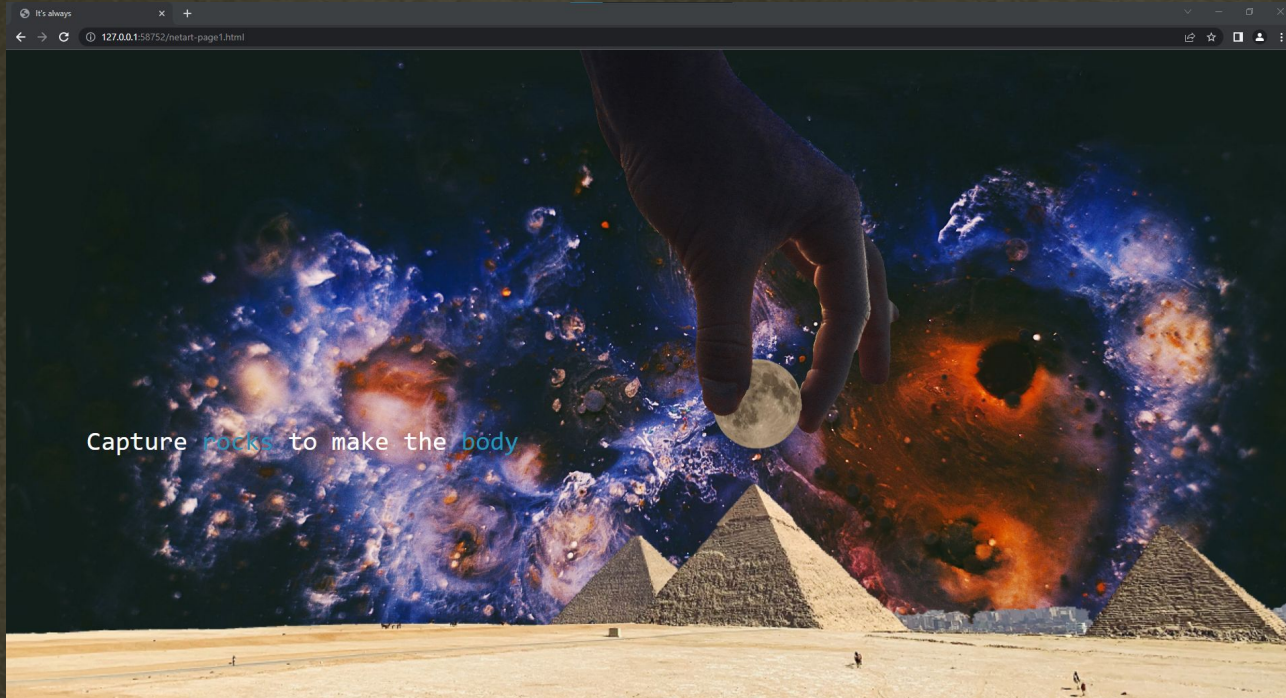

This one was the most difficult, simply because I was eager to start the process without much knowledge. However, with a few more demos in the class, I was able to successfully recreate my draft.

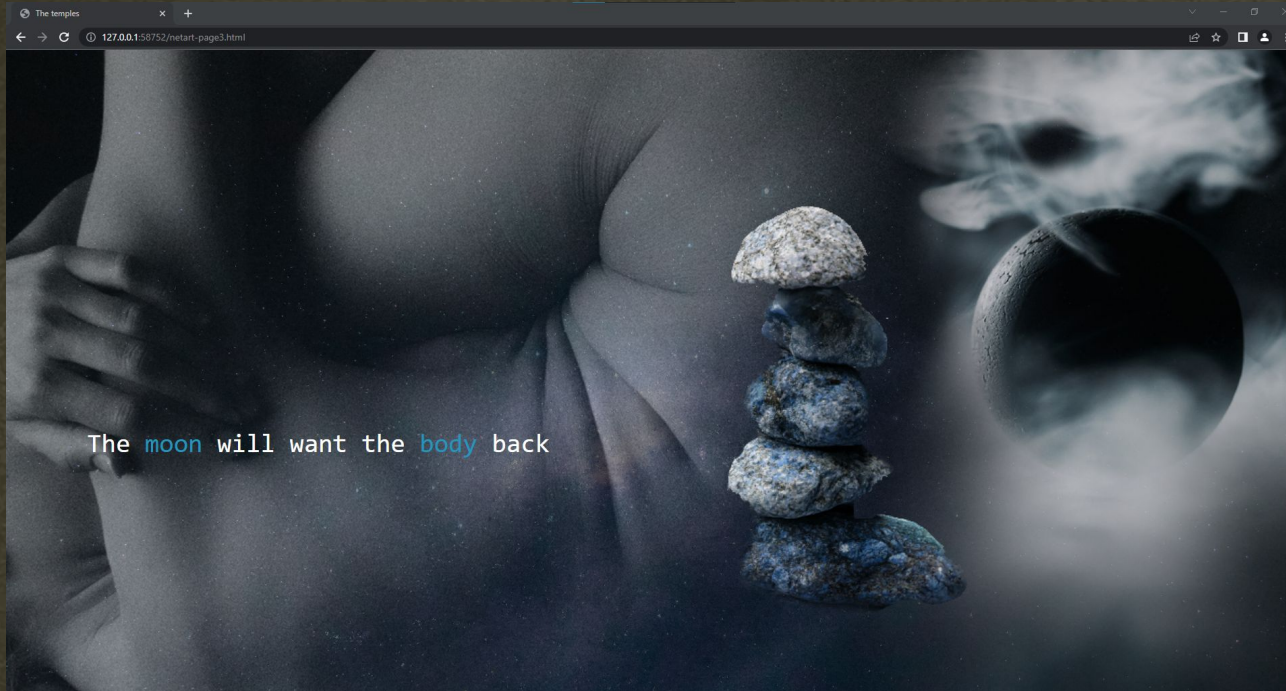
# Final Pages

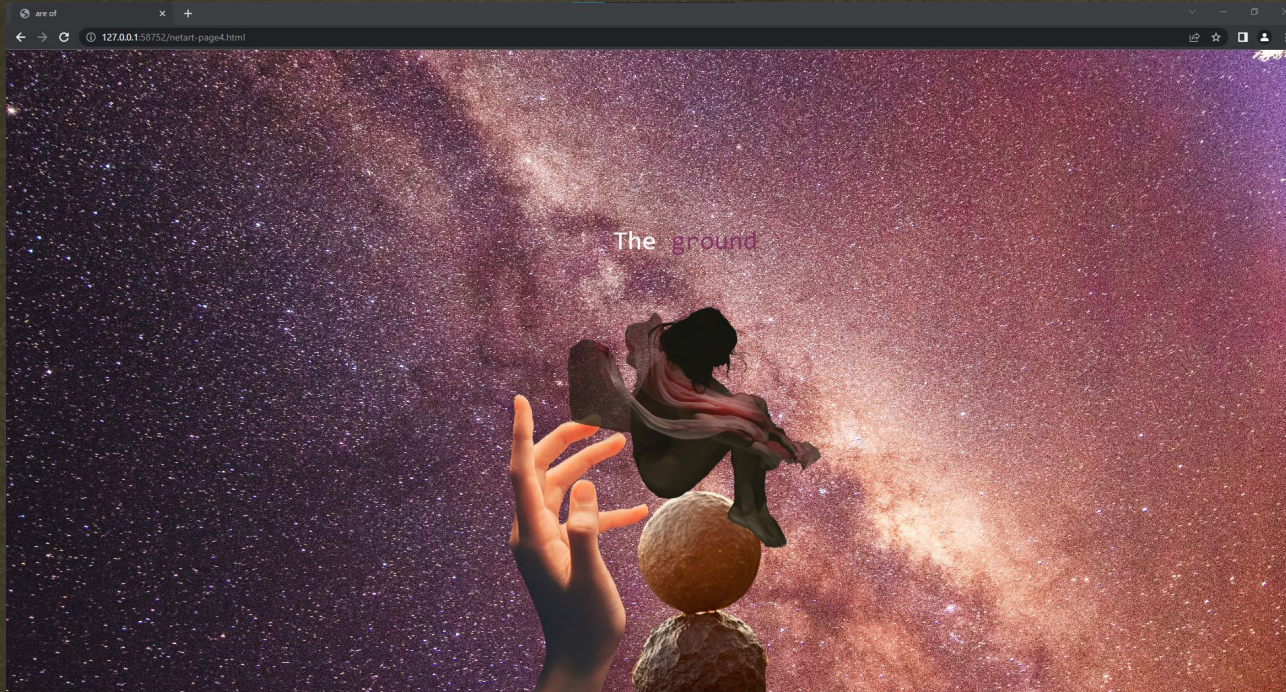

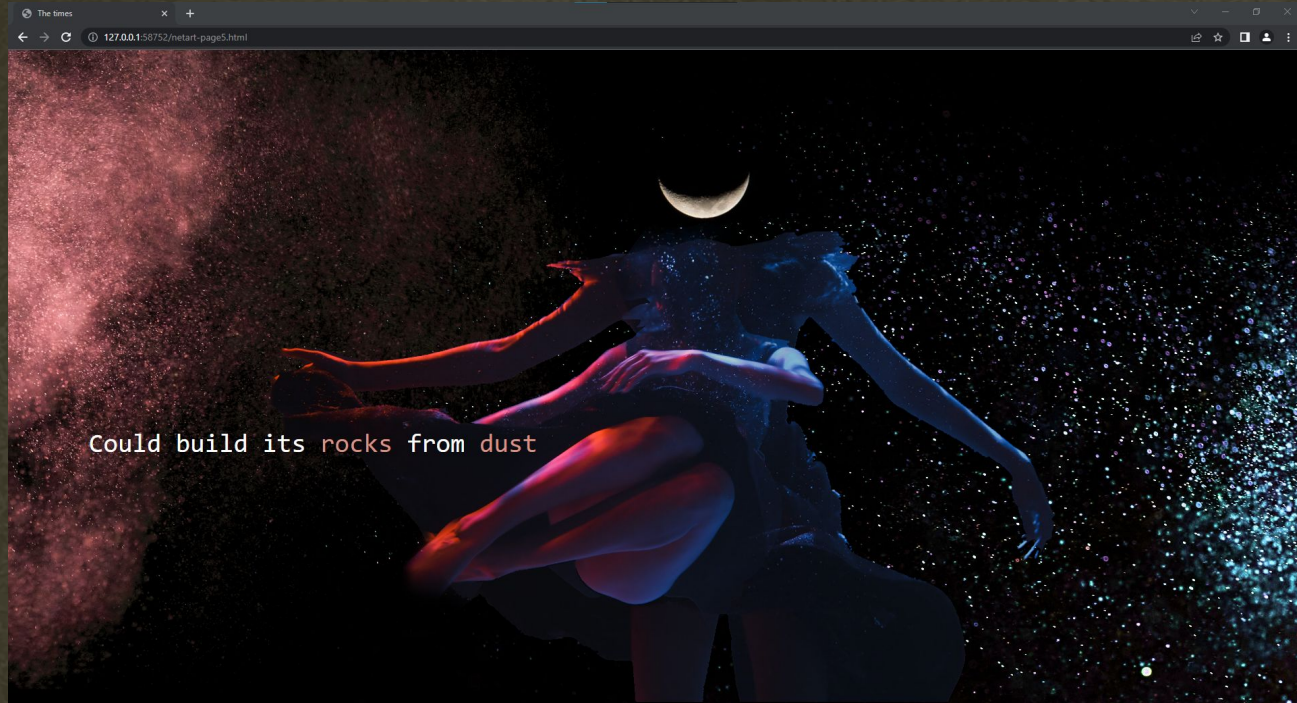


## Fourth Page
